The above case has been set for oral argument on June 16, 2011, as the 2nd case, and will be held in the Courtroom of the Temple of Justice. Cases 1 and 2 will be heard in the morning session, with Court convening at 9:00 a.m. Case 3 will be heard in the afternoon session, with Court convening at 1:30 p.m.

Counsel should report to the bailiff prior to 8:45 a.m. for morning cases and 1:15 p.m. for afternoon case.

Oral argument will be twenty minutes per side. If a party wishes to request thirty minutes per side for oral argument, the request must be submitted in writing. The Court strongly encourages that, whenever possible, oral argument should be presented by only one-or at most two-counsel per side.

If counsel are aware of any potential amicus curiae, they should be advised RAP 10.2(f), as amended effective September 1, 1999, requires that amicus curiae briefs not requested by the court must be served and received by the court not later than 30 days prior to oral argument.

Metered parking is available in the General Administration parking garage located directly east of the General Administration Building on the Capitol campus; and on the entrance roads to the Capitol campus bracketing the Tivoli Fountain. Please also be advised that there is a major construction project that will impact arrival times to the State campus where the Temple of Justice is located once you exit I-5 from both the north and south bound exits ramp. Opinions are usually released at 8:00 a.m. on Thursdays.
