Hi Ken,

thank you for the spending the time with me Tuesday working through the query and mapping tools. I believe you are right about how I was not able to find the 2008 listing for Kalaloch Creek. Yesterday, I ran queries on and checked out the maps for all of the listed streams in the Hoh Watershed. Everything checked out except for the problems that we discussed over the phone about Fisher Creek, Split Creek and the reach of South Fork of the Hoh that they empty into. I gathered from your e-mail yesterday that DOE will be making the necessary corrections. I've attached a photo with the stream names that the Hoh Tribes uses for the streams crossing the H-1080. Fisher Creek has also been called McQuarry Creek so I combine the two names when referring to the stream. The Hoh Tribe places thermographs each summer in Fisher-McQuarry, Split, Line, and Hoot Creeks. Fisher-McQuarry and Split Creeks are still out of compliance for 7-DADMax temperature.

The Internet site for the Water Quality Assessment will be a useful tool. After checking out both WRIA 20 and 21, I came to the conclusion that there needs to be additional monitoring work performed on other streams within the Hoh Tribe's U&A, given that DOE has little if any data on several important streams that had and will continue to have an extensive amount of timber harvest taking place within their watersheds.

The Hoh Tribe will be providing additional water quality information to DOE in the future. I also know of some past stream temperature information for this region that was gathered by both a state and a federal agency that also needs to be submitted to DOE. Part of the data was collected on the very same streams that the Hoh Tribe has been monitoring. I will contact the two agencies and check on their willingness to provide the information.
