Dear Chairman Crankovich and Commissioners McClain and Jewell:

I am writing in response to your July 22 petition to repeal the Department of Ecology's (Ecology) temporary emergency ground water withdrawal in upper Kittitas County (County). I am well aware of the situation in Kittitas County and the Yakima Basin as a whole, where water supplies have been a concern for more than 30 years.

RCW 34.05.350(3) (Emergency rules and amendments) allows for petitions to the governor to request the immediate repeal of an emergency rule within seven days of rule adoption. The statute says that the governor, within seven days after submission of the petition, shall either deny the petition in writing, or order the immediate repeal of the rule.

Under RCW 34.05.350, I must consider whether the conditions cited by the agency meet the Administrative Procedures Act definition of emergency: "that immediate adoption . . . of a rule is necessary for the preservation of the public health, safety, and general welfare, and that observing the time requirements of notice and opportunity to comment upon adoption of a permanent rule would be contrary to the public interest."

The emergency rule that is the subject of your petition was necessary to close a water resources management gap that was created when the County and Ecology did not reach agreement on a path forward. The rule was necessary to protect both existing and future water users in the area from the adverse implications of future droughts and water shortages in the greater Yakima Basin.

For these reasons, I find that Ecology's emergency rule meets the requirements of RCW 34.05.350, and I am therefore denying your petition.



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To address the effect of the rule, I have asked Ecology to amend the emergency rule to clarify that people with vested building permit applications or issued building permits as of July 16, 2009, are not subject to the withdrawal rule. In addition, I have asked Ecology to quickly develop water bank solutions to provide mitigation water that will support new development moving forward.

While I support Ecology's temporary withdrawal, I have asked the department to move quickly and propose a permanent rule in the near future, both to provide better options and clarity for future water supply in the upper county, and to provide full opportunity for public notice and comment.

I am encouraged to learn that the County plans to renew negotiations with Ecology regarding a permanent path forward. Ecology Director Jay Manning has assured me that the agency will work with the County to find an acceptable long-term solution. I urge each of you to join this effort. Our local communities, regional economy and shared environmental resources will be best protected if state and county governments work together, using both the County's land management authority and the state's water management authority.
