

IWG Collection Group (Grp #1) Recommendation Template for Fiber and Organics

I) Within Regulated Areas, Responsible Solid Waste Collectors shall offer Required Services.

A) Regulated Areas: The concept is to concentrate on the highly – and densely- populated areas, where curbside collection of garbage is the normal practice. This would be either in municipal jurisdictions or in urbanized/suburbanized unincorporated areas. This could roughly correspond to the area within the Urban Growth boundary. The main point is to exclude rural counties or rural portions of counties.

B) Responsible Solid Waste Collectors: the responsible municipality or the certified hauler, whichever is the existing collector for an area.

C) Required Services:

Residential can customers	4) Curbside collection of yardwaste. Curbside collection of foodwaste and food-contaminated paper. (Local planning jurisdictions can decide whether these 2 are co-collected or not, and whether to exclude animal products from foodwaste)	2012 ?	Subscribers either pay fee or cost can be rolled into garbage service. If yardwaste is collected separately from foodwaste, subscription and any attached subscription fee may be optional. Foodwaste must be mandatory fee or rolled into garbage cost.
Multi-family detached container	5) Curbside collection of yardwaste. Curbside collection of foodwaste and food-contaminated paper. (Local planning jurisdictions can decide whether these 2 are co-collected or not, and whether to exclude animal products from foodwaste)	2013 ? Commercial	6) Curbside collection of all organics	2013 ?	Subscribers either pay fee or cost can be partially or completely rolled into garbage service. Fee may be no more than fee for equivalent amount of garbage.

D) Requirements Implemented: By the following (statutory/regulatory) means: (e.g., require changes to Solid Waste Comprehensive Plans, develop Model Ordinance, etc.)

II) Customer Requirements.

A) Fiber

- i. By 2014 disposal of paper (all types) will be prohibited
- ii. Jurisdictions can be exempted from the above requirement if they have conducted a valid, DOE-funded and approved waste stream analysis which shows that the proportion of paper in the disposal stream is < 10%.
- iii. DOE will give grants for education and enforcement of the ban

B) Organics

- i. By 2015 disposal of organics (all types) will be prohibited
- ii. Jurisdictions can be exempted from the above requirement if they have conducted a valid, DOE-funded and approved waste stream analysis which shows that the proportion of organics in the disposal stream is < 10%.
- iii. DOE will give grants for education and enforcement of the ban

C) Garbage rates. “Flat “ garbage rates/taxes will be prohibited by 2012. All garbage must be financed from variable (not necessarily inverted) charges.
