RE: Your request to extend temporary trust water right donation CG1-*00671C@1(B)

Dear Mr. Sayer:

This letter is a response to your request to extend the term of trust water right donation CG1-*00671C@1(B). In a letter to the Department of Ecology (Ecology) dated August 10, 2012 (received on September 11, 2012), to Buck Smith of my staff, you wrote:

*The purpose of this letter is to request a time extension for the temporary donation of water right number CG1-*00671C@1(B) to the Washington State Trust Water Right Program (TWRP), pursuant to RCW 90.42.080(1)(b).*

*The Washington State Department of Corrections (DOC) has leased to Cadman, Inc. an instantaneous quantity (Qi) of 676 gallons per minute (gpm) and a cumulative annual volume (Qa) of 232.4 acre-feet per year (afy). On April 7, 2011, Ecology approved a temporary change (No. CG1-*00671C@2) transferring 600 gpm and 232.4 afy from the TWRP to Cadman's Gold Bar mine. As a result, 76 gpm (Qi) and zero afy (Qa) currently remain in the TWRP.*

The water right was originally placed into the TWRP for a 10-year period, ending on September 30, 2012. Cadman requests that Ecology extend the period of temporary donation of the 76 gpm (Qi) to January 1, 2036, which coincides with the termination date of Cadman's lease with DOC. If use of the trusted quantity is required prior to this end date, Cadman will provide 30-day written notification to Ecology.

Under the authority of this letter, your request has been approved. The subject temporary trust donation of 76 gallons per minute shall hereby remain in effect until January 1, 2036. All other attributes, conditions, and provisions of the originally issued decision shall remain in effect as they existed prior to the issuance of this approval.

You have a right to appeal this action to the Pollution Control Hearing Board (PCHB) within 30 days of the date of receipt of this document. The appeal process is governed by Chapter 43.21B RCW and Chapter 371-08 WAC. "Date of receipt" is defined in RCW 43.21B.001(2).

To appeal, you must do the following within 30 days of the date of receipt of this document:

File your appeal and a copy of this document with the PCHB (see addresses below). Filing means actual receipt by the PCHB during regular business hours.

Serve a copy of your appeal and this document on Ecology in paper form - by mail or in person. (See addresses below.) Email is not accepted.

You must also comply with other applicable requirements in Chapter 43.21B RCW and Chapter 371-08 WAC.


