

In the matter of adopting the **Interstate Transport Analysis for the Fine Particulate Matter, Nitrogen Dioxide, Lead, and Ozone National Ambient Air Quality Standards** and a **BART Order Revision for the BP Cherry Point Refinery** into the Washington State Implementation Plan

## SIP ADOPTION ORDER

The Washington State Department of Ecology (Ecology) offered the public an opportunity to review and request a hearing on the following revisions to the State Implementation Plan (SIP):

1. Interstate Transport SIP Revision for the 2006 24-hour Fine Particulate Matter (PM<sub>2.5</sub>) National Ambient Air Quality Standard (NAAQS).
2. Interstate Transport SIP Revision for the 2010 1-hour Nitrogen Dioxide (NO<sub>2</sub>), 2008 3-Month Rolling Average Lead (Pb) NAAQS, and 2008 8-hour Ozone (O<sub>3</sub>) NAAQS.
3. Revised BART Order for BP Cherry Point Refinery to include in Washington's Regional Haze SIP.

We did not receive a request to hold a public hearing. We accepted comments from March 9, 2015, through April 10, 2015. No comments were received.

Ecology met all state and federal procedural requirements for public outreach by taking the following actions:

- Held a mandatory 60-day consultation with the Federal Land Managers on the BART Order revision from August 5, 2014 through October 3, 2014. We received no comments.
- Published a legal notice announcing the public review and comment period in one newspaper on March 9, 2015. This allowed Ecology to meet the requirement for 30 days of advance hearing notice.
- Announced the public comment period and public hearing date on our online public involvement calendar and Ecology's website.
- Provided an opportunity for the public to request a hearing by April 1, 2015. We did not receive a request for a hearing, so we did not hold one, as allowed by 40 CFR Section 51.102 and WAC 173-400-171 "Public Involvement."

IT IS HEREBY ORDERED that the referenced documents, constituting the revisions, are approved and adopted by the Department of Ecology as part of the Washington State Implementation Plan. All provisions of the Washington State Implementation Plan inconsistent with the attached documents are superseded.
