Directions to the Meeting room: Capitol Campus OB2, room SL-04:

I suggest parking in the Natural Resources Building (NRB) parking lot and then walking to Office Building 2 (OB2).

From I-5, take State Capitol Exit 105 – you'll be on 14th Avenue. Go through the tunnel and turn right onto Capitol Way (traffic signal here). Go right on 11th Avenue (another signal). Go right on Washington (another signal). Go left down ramp to visitor parking area (\$.50/hr at the meter/kiosk).

Walk from the parking lot, along the outside ramp toward the entrance of the NRB (rotunda and main lobby). The Licensing Building will be to your right as you walk toward the NRB lobby. Walk PAST the main rotunda entrance and along the NRB. You will almost immediately see a sign in front of stairs with an arrow pointing right that says: "Office Building 2, Department of Social and Health Services." Walk up the stairs and straight ahead toward the entrance to OB2.

Once through the doors, walk straight ahead to the Information Desk, where you are required to check in. SL-04 is on the street level.
