Dear Mr. and Mrs. Baker:

On September 19, 2006, the Washington State Department of Ecology (Ecology) issued you a Section 401 Water Quality Certification (Section 401 Certification) for the Shandalah Shores Condominium Complex.

According to a letter from the U.S. Army Corps of Engineers (Corps), dated October 19, 2012, the Corps authorized a time extension for the project until November 21, 2015. It is our understanding that the project has not been constructed as of the date of this letter and the Corps permit is now expired. Based on this information, Ecology is officially **rescinding** the Section 401 Certification (Order #3830), dated September 19, 2006.

If you decide to proceed with your project in the future, you must reapply for a Corps permit which may trigger a Section 401 Certification.
