RE: **Order No. 1991:** Administrative Order for placement of fill in 4, 122 square feet (0.09 of an acre) of a 10,454 square foot (0.24 of an acre) isolated seasonal wetland. The proposed project involves construction of a 13, 327 square foot boat trailer parking lot adjacent to the entrance road within Odlin County Park, Lopez Island, San Juan County. The purpose of the project is to provide off-street boat trailer parking for users of the existing Odlin Park boat ramp, and to reduce traffic hazards to motorists and park visitors.

The request for an administrative order for proposed work in wetlands in Odlin County Park, Lopez Island, San Juan County has been reviewed. The State of Washington has determined that the proposed work, as conditioned by the enclosed Order, will comply with applicable provisions of Chapter 90.48 RCW and other appropriate requirements of State law.

5. Nothing in this Order waives Ecology's authority to issue additional orders if Ecology determines further actions are necessary to implement the water quality laws of the state. Further, Ecology retains continuing jurisdiction to make modifications hereto through supplemental order, if additional impacts due to project construction or operation are identified (*e.g.*, violations of water quality standards, downstream erosion, etc.), or if additional conditions are necessary to further protect the public interest.

Failure to comply with this Order may result in the issuance of civil penalties or other actions, whether administrative or judicial, to enforce the terms of this Order.

Any person aggrieved by Order NO. 1991 may obtain review thereof by appeal. Pursuant to ch. 43.21B. RCW, a person can appeal this order to the Pollution Control Hearings Board within 30 days of the date of receipt of this Order. Any such appeal must be sent to the Washington Pollution Control Hearings Board, PO Box 40903, Olympia, WA 98504-0903. Concurrently, a copy of the appeal must be sent to the Department of Ecology, Shorelands and Environmental Assistance Program, Attn: Loree' Randall, PO Box 47600, Olympia, WA 98504-7600. These procedures are consistent with the provisions of Chapter 43.21B RCW and the rules and regulations adopted there under.
