I would like to represent Clallam County on the advisory council on matters of tourism as well as ocean policy and management issues along the Washington coast. I am a retired Navy Chief (E-7) since 2007 and have extensive knowledge of working and collaborating with others in small and large group settings. While in the Navy, I have visited numerous ports of call and have experienced the many different oceans that were clearly contaminated or, conversely, well maintained waterways.

I am President of Olympic Game Farm (OGF) that exhibits, trains, and educates tourists on exotic and native wildlife through guided lecture tours. OGF has approximately 86,000 (as of Dec 31, 2012) international and domestic visitors each year. OGF has up to 15 permanent and seasonal employees that care for captive bred animals. I also train captive bred wildlife for film and television portrayals and OGF worked exclusively for Walt Disney Studios from 1950's to the 1970's.

My grandparents on my mother's side have long been associated with sport and commercial fishing. As a result, prior to my enlistment in the Navy in 1987, I was a crewmember—in the summers—of a commercial fishing boat based out of Douglas/Juneau, AK for 4 summers. This firsthand experience of ocean and fishing management will provide me with some working knowledge that may very well be discussed at the advisory council meetings.

I am currently a member of the Dungeness River Management Team (DRMT) and already work closely with a myriad of government and special interest groups associated with clean water and fish riparian habitat on the Olympic Peninsula. I believe that would provide a unique insight for the advisory council and for the DRMT as well.

In conclusion, I believe that I am uniquely suited to provide feedback on ocean policy and management issues from a tourism viewpoint. By doing so, I will have gained the wisdom that is provided at the advisory council and that I have aided Washington State.

I would like to endorse Roy Morris for the tourism position on the Washington Coastal Marine Advisory Council (WCMAC). I have worked with Roy on multiple committees, both as a colleague and on our MRC for four terms. He has a remarkably varied background in public education (as a former teacher and principal) and natural sciences; having served multiple terms on both Clallam MRC and NPC MRC, Olympic Coast National Marine Sanctuary Advisory Council, the Lake Ozette Sockeye Salmon Steering Committee and several other salmon restoration groups, and he is on the BOD for Coast Savers.
