Page 13, Section 3.4.2.2, Table 7, West Fork Sanpoil River: Revise length within shoreline jurisdiction from “5.6 miles” to “2.5 miles.”

West Fork Sanpoil River	No	2.5 miles
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Page 23, Section 4.1.6.1, 4th line: Insert “including irrigation” after “water withdrawal.”

Water-dependent uses commonly include, but are not limited to, fishing, water withdrawal, including irrigation, and cargo loading and unloading.

Page 49, Section 5.1.4.1.1, 6th line: Delete Pierre Lake from list of off-reservation lakes of cultural importance to the Colville Confederated Tribes (lake is in Stevens County). Move Elbow Lake, located on the reservation, to the in-reservation list of lakes of cultural importance to Colville Confederated Tribes.

Lakes of particular cultural importance to the members of the Colville Confederated Tribes include North and South Twin, Round, La Fleur, Nicholas, Elbow, and Bourgeau, and Ellen in the off-reservation part of the County (GEI 2004).

Page 63, Section 5.2.2.3, 2nd line: Indicate that “industrial runoff and effluent” inputs are coming from upstream of Ferry County as there are no sources for industrial runoff occurring within the County..

Water quality in the Columbia River is impacted from reservoir operations, industrial runoff, and effluent inputs occurring upstream of the County boundary.

Page 66, Section 5.2.2.4.2, 3rd paragraph, 5th line: Delete “dams and diversions.”

Riparian vegetation and riparian wetlands along Columbia River tributary streams within the shoreline jurisdiction of Ferry County have been affected by combinations of the following activities: water resource developments; draining of lands to establish agricultural and grazing lands; roads; timber management; natural and human-caused fire events; and residential development.

Page 68, Section 5.2.3.3, 2nd line: Delete “industrial runoff.”

The upstream extent of Sanpoil River watershed is potentially affected by non-point sources of pollutants such as agricultural and residential runoff from upstream developments.

Page 80, Section 5.2.4.4, 1st and 2nd line: Delete “in the Colville National Forest”.

Curlew Lake is an estimated 870-acre lake located at approximately 2,300 feet of elevation, north of Republic, Washington.

Page 80, Section 5.2.4.4, 4th paragraph, after the 1st sentence: Add the following sentence:

Curlew Lake once supported a population of silver trout. Remnant populations may still occur in Curlew Lake.

Page 82, Section 5.2.4.4, 3rd paragraph, 2nd sentence: Add “bass”.

[Swan Lake] provides habitat for bass and rainbow trout.

Page 97, Section 6, 2nd paragraph, 4th line: Delete “substantially.”

Public access facilities in the County may be adequate for its residents; however, with the downturn in the mining and timber industries (the biggest employers in the County), recreation has become more important to Ferry County’s economy.

Page 98, Section 6, Table 28, Beal Park: Add fishing “and water” access, “seasonal” outhouse, “fire pits, and interpretative signage.”

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Page 100, Section 6, Table 28, 10 Mile Creek Campground: Delete “and free.”

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Page 101, Section 6, Table 28, Bourgeau Lake: Add “boat launch, outhouse.”

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Page 102, Section 6, Table 28, Swan Lake: Add “dock, boat launch, and kitchen area”

Swan Lake	Swan Lake Campground	Fee-area, campground, vault toilets, picnic tables, kitchen area, dock, boat launch, non-motorized boats, swimming area, trails, and fishing	USFS
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Page 108, Section 8, References: Revise title of Perry, 2008 reference to read “A Brief History of Ferry County”

Kettle River Reach Characterization Tables and Reach Maps

Page A-12, Kettle River Reach 3, Geological Hazards, 3rd line: Delete “no mine sites.”

No areas susceptible to seismic hazards are located within Reach 3.

Page A-24, Kettle River Reach 6, Channel Migration Zone, 2nd line: Delete “in.”

The CMZ is wide along most of the reach extent.

Page A-32, Kettle River Reach 8, Existing Public Access, 1st and 2nd line: Delete “public access is minimal.” Revise “formal” to “formal legal.”

Reach 8 is entirely privately owned. U.S. Route 395 and Kettle Falls International Railway train tracks border the western side of the reach; otherwise, there is no formal legal public access.

Page A-41, Kettle River Reach 10, Recreational Use – SR 10a: Insert “illegal” to water access points.

Unauthorized, illegal water access points and rafting along river

Page A-45, Kettle River Reach 11, Recreational Use: Insert “illegal” to water access points.

Unauthorized, illegal water access for river floating in the summertime

Page A-51, Kettle River Reach 12, Level of Existing Function – SR 12c: Revise “agricultural development” to “resource development.”

SR 12c is designated as Partially Functioning, based on transportation corridors limiting channel migration and resource development.

Page A-51, Kettle River Reach 12, Recreational development – SR 12c: Insert “illegal” to water access points.

Unauthorized, illegal diving off of railroad trestle bridge

Sanpoil River Reach Characterization Tables and Reach Maps

Page C-35, Granite Creek, Water Quality: Add “wildlife” as a source of water quality impact.

The Republic Reach is listed as a water of concern for pH. Water quality may be impacted from residential, wildlife, and roadway runoffs.

Appendix D
Lake Groups Reach Characterization Tables and Reach Maps

Page D-19, Sanpoil Lake, Habitat Characteristics and PHS Presence, last sentence: Revise last sentence as follows:

Land to the north of Sanpoil Lake is mapped as associated wetlands and are partially under agricultural use.
