The following changes are recommended to clarify elements of the City’s updated SMP

1	<b>Contents</b>	<p><u>Appendix A – Shoreline Characterization and Analysis &amp; Cumulative Impacts</u>  <i>(Not adopted as part of the SMP)</i></p> <p><u>Appendix B - Restoration Plan</u></p> <p><u>Appendix C - Shoreline Critical Areas Regulations</u></p>	The appendices were included as part of the main body of the SMP, but not listed in the table of contents.
2	<b>Chapter 1 - Introduction</b>	The SMP (or “Master Program”) consists of environmental designations for the shoreline segments and goals, policies, and regulations applicable to uses and modifications within the Shoreline Management Zone ( <u>SMZ, synonymous with shoreline jurisdiction</u> ).	This is the first opportunity to indicate how the two terms are used interchangeably in the document.
3	<b>Chapter 1 - Introduction</b>	Appendices to the SMP include an inventory of existing shoreline conditions; analysis and characterization of the shorelines of the City; a shorelines restoration planning report; and shoreline critical area regulations. <u>The restoration plan and critical area regulations are considered part of the officially adopted SMP.</u>	Specifically identifies what is part of the SMP and what is not.
4	<b>Chapter 1 - Introduction</b>	The City of Sedro-Woolley has <del>conducted</del> <u>developed</u> a comprehensive SMP <del>update</del> with the assistance of a grant administered by the Washington State Department of Ecology. The <del>update</del> <u>document</u> has been prepared consistent with the SMA and its implementing guidelines.	This is the city’s first state approved SMP.

5	<b>Chapter 3, B. 1.</b>	The city owns the majority of the land within the <u>city's shoreline</u> jurisdiction.	Grammatical fix.
6	<b>Chapter 5.3 B. Prohibited Uses</b>	<p>The following uses are prohibited in all shoreline environments unless addressed separately in this shoreline master program under another use.</p> <p>1. Aquaculture; <u>There are no aquaculture activities in the SMZ. Per zoning regulations on the lands within the SMZ, aquaculture is not a permitted use, therefore aquaculture is not allowed in the SMZ;</u></p> <p>2. Mining; <u>There are no mining activities or mineral resource lands in the SMZ, therefore mining is not allowed in the SMZ;</u></p> <p>3. Forest Practices. There are no forestry lands in the SMZ, therefore forest practices are not allowed in the SMZ ; and</p> <p>4. Industrial development. There is no industrially zoned property in the SMZ, therefore there are no industrial activities allowed in the SMZ.</p>	Suggested changes to help explain the prohibition of aquaculture and mining in the SMP.
