3.	Table 29.01.200 (2): Shoreline Use and Modification Matrix	Richard Collingham	Revise footnote 2 on page 62 of SMP to state that commercial and industrial development in sub-reach 4b is prohibited.	
4.	General	Washington State Department of Fish and Wildlife	WDFW would appreciate being included in discussion about future development projects that impact Priority Habitats.

7.	4.6 Historic, Cultural, Scientific, and Educational Resources Element	Washington State Department of Archaeology and Historic Preservation	DAHP recommends revised language for Goal B. Suggested language reads as follows: Encourage educational, <u>interpretive, restoration,</u> and scientific projects and programs that foster a greater appreciation for the importance of shoreline management, water-oriented activities, environmental conservation, <u>historic preservation, and local cultural and historic connections with the City's shoreline.</u>	
8.	4.6 Historic, Cultural, Scientific, and Educational Resources Element	Washington State Department of Archaeology and Historic Preservation	DAHP recommends revised language in policy (2) (b) to read something like the following: <i>Encourage educational, interpretive, and restoration projects and programs that foster a greater appreciation of the importance of shoreline management as it relates to management and protection of historic, cultural, scientific, and educational resources in the context of protecting and balancing no net loss of ecological functions.</i>	
9.	29.01.120(3)(a)(ii) Natural Environment Designation	Washington State Department of Archaeology and Historic Preservation	DAHP recommends revised language to read something like the following: <i>Maintenance, preservation, rehabilitation, restoration, and management of significant scientific, historic, cultural, educational research and low-impact passive recreational uses are allowed in addition to existing uses, in balance with no net loss of ecological function/value.</i>	
10.	29.01.350(1)(b)	Washington State Department of	DAHP recommends revised language to read as follows: <i>Dredging and dredge disposal shall be prohibited on or in cultural or historic sites that are listed in, or determined</i>

11.	29.01.180(39) Definitions	Washington State Department of Archaeology and Historic Preservation	On lines 19-20 on page 157, DAHP recommends rewording of the definition of “cultural and historic resources” to read: “...means buildings, structures, sites, districts, objects, and areas having archaeological, cultural, historic or scientific value of significance.”	
12.	General – Archaeology and Historic Resources	Washington State Department of Archaeology and Historic Preservation	The language in the Draft SMP is very broad and does not refer to specific processes or requirements under state laws for the protection or management of archaeological resources. DAHP attached a copy of our model language for your use that would allow more specificity and guidance when dealing with archaeological and historical resources.
