

# Rulemaking - Timeline

- January 25 – ‘Final’ language to code revisers office
- Feb 9-11 – Adoption (director signs)
  - Final language, Revised Cost/Benefit Analysis and SBEIS, Concise Explanatory Statement, References, Implementation plan, Rule Adoption Notice
- Feb 14 – Filing deadline (180 days after draft rule filing)
- Feb 15/16 – Public notice
- 31 days after adoption – Effective date

# Rulemaking – Effective date?

- “On the ground” – after local update and adoption in your shoreline master program
  - ▣ Geoduck provisions
  
- Procedural – 31 days after adoption
  - ▣ Amending your shoreline master programs Ch. 173-26-201(1)

# Rulemaking - Geoduck

- DNR's wild stock geoduck fishery not "aquaculture" – not subject to local permits
- Critical saltwater habitats definition and aquaculture general policies back to original
- AGO 2007 No. 1 reminder – not all aquaculture is 'development'
- Conditional use permit for all new geoduck (only)

# Geoduck – Conditional use permit

- Permit application
  - Minimize redundancy with NWP 48 and 401 WQC
  - Baseline ecological survey required
- No renewal date; Ch. 173-27-100 applies (revision)
- Monitoring and reporting required
- Limits and conditions more flexible
- Public and tribal notice required
