Shoreline Management

The Shoreline Management Act declares preference for several shoreline uses, and in this order (RCW 90.58.020):

- ✓ Recognize and protect the statewide interest over local interest
- ✓ Preserve the natural character of the shoreline
- ✓ Result in long term over short term benefit
- ✓ Protect the resources and ecology of the shoreline
- ✓ Increase public access to publicly owned areas of the shorelines
- ✓ Increase recreational opportunities for the public in the shoreline

# But there are also internal mission tensions...

- **Keep it Natural**, but “in those **limited instances...**”:
  - Single family residences
  - Ports
  - **Recreation**
  - Water dependent industrial and commercial
  - **Other development that will provide an opportunity for substantial numbers of the people to enjoy the shorelines of the state.**

## RCW 90.58.340


- All state agencies ... shall review administrative and management policies... so as to achieve a use policy on said land consistent with the policy of this chapter....

[The legislature] finds that ever increasing pressures of additional uses are being placed on the shorelines necessitating **increased coordination in the management and development** of the shorelines of the state.

SCORP notes “. . . The public wants facilities in settings that include water access *more than any other type of setting.*”



Acreage by Land Classification








# Lake Sammamish State Park Land Classification and Long-Term Boundary


# Nearshore Restoration Opportunities
