



# Fish and Wildlife Protection through Shoreline Master Programs

# WDFW and SMPs: What we look for

- Identify and protect priority shoreline areas *before* other planning decisions are made
- Avoid future development pressures on priority shoreline areas
- Avoid future species listings and associated costs
- Develop restoration and enhancement of fish & wildlife habitat




