 - Update county profile information annually
 - Review profile information from Ecology to ensure accuracy (recycling hotline and facilities)
 - Invest time initially to help build information on the site
 - **Use it, so that your colleagues will do the same**

The Benefits

- Helps **tell the story** of solid waste in Washington

- Facilitates **learning from others'** successes and mistakes
- Archives and **provides institutional memory** for the state and local programs
- Provides ability to adapt **promotional and educational materials**
- **Eliminates "reinvention of the wheel"** and broadens resource pool



Other Outcomes: Approximately 10,000 brochures have been distributed to County residents, along with an advertisement in the Whidbey Almanac, with distribution of 30,000. Actual residents reached can be estimated at 20,000.

Lessons Learned: Island County continues to alter handling methods to minimize breakage of fluorescent lamps. Twelve-inch diameter collection tubes have been used in the past with some success. Concrete forms (sonotubes) had been sealed to retard absorption of atmospheric moisture, but still prove too soft after one year of use. Current efforts include replacement of these with more durable corrugated poly drain pipe. Also see the discussion of battery collection on the MRW Collection & Disposal worksheet.


