Review of Ecology's Priority Questions

The list:

1. What criteria would you use to prioritize the list of chemicals of high concern for children?
2. Are there classes of materials that are more problematic- for example, are there certain types of plastics that are worse than others? Are there some products/materials that are likely to be flammable and require the addition of chemical flame retardants?

Reporting requirements:

3. Are there classes of materials that should be exempted from reporting, i.e. materials that are very unlikely to ever contain a chemical of high concern for children?
4. How do you currently comply with existing standards such as the Consumer Product Safety Act and Prop 65? Can a demonstration of compliance under other laws be used to demonstrate compliance with the CSPA reporting requirement?
5. If you sell your product in Europe, how will you test your products to comply with REACH or other EU standards?
6. Should 3rd party testing be used?
