**List of Substantive Requirements**

1. Projects within the City of Olympia are to comply with the following standards and best management practices:

1. *Engineering Design and Development Standards*
2. *Drainage Design and Erosion Control Manual for Olympia Region*

2. The piling removal is to comply with the Washington Department of Natural Resources, Puget Sound Initiative – Derelict Creosote Piling Removal Program, *Best Management Practices For Pile Removal & Disposal* (Contact: Lisa Kaufman, 360-854-2808)

3. The monitoring wells fall within the jurisdiction of the Department of Ecology. (Contact Well Coordinator, 360-407-6648)

1. Notice of Intent to Install: The property owner, owner’s agent, or water well operator shall notify the department of their intent to begin well construction, reconstruction-alteration, or decommissioning procedures at least seventy-two hours before starting work.

2. The investigation shall use the minimum standards established under this chapter to construct and decommission wells. State of Washington, Minimum Standards for Construction and Maintenance of Wells, Chapter 171-160 WAC

4. The management or disposal of dangerous or hazardous wastes shall comply with Chapter 173-303 WAC (Hazardous Waste Management Program Contact: Joe Cason, 360-407-6360)

5. Washington Industrial Safety and Health Act (WISHA), Chapter 49.17 RCW requires employers to provide safe and healthful workplaces for all employees. It gives L&I responsibility to establish and enforce workplace safety and health rules. (Contact: 360-533-8200)
