



2013-15 Stormwater Grant Program

In 2013 the Washington State Legislature provided support to Washington stormwater programs through an appropriations bill totaling \$100 M. This bill included four sections: \$15 M for project-specific planning and design, \$150k to Ecology to engage stakeholders in creating a long-term funding program that would be incorporated into Ecology's existing integrated funding program, \$18.7 M for design and construction of projects in specific communities, and \$66 M for a competitive grant program to fund project implementation and construction.


\$15 M for Planning and Design

- These grants will help permittees develop shovel-ready stormwater projects.
- 82% of Phase I and II communities accepted \$120K planning grants, 87% have signed agreements.
- These permittees have identified and begun planning 147 potential stormwater projects in their communities.
- Of these projects, 109 contain Low Impact Development elements.
- Funds will be expended before August 1, 2014, to prepare for the 2014 competitive grant process.

\$150 K to Create a Long Term Funding Program

- Stakeholders work group was formed in September and consists of 14 outside stakeholders and 6 Ecology Employees.
- Stakeholders represent small and large communities from eastern and western Washington, ports, and environmental advocacy groups.
- Work group is on target to have draft guidelines and applications developed by spring 2014.

Work Group Timeline



\$18.7 M to fund Community Specific Projects (Provisos)

- 15 grants to 14 communities.
- All recipients have been contacted and are in the negation process; over 50% are ready for final signatures.
- Some projects, such as the City of Tacoma Spanaway Lake Project, have begun work.
- Ecology expects that the bulk of the funding will be distributed once construction is complete in 2015.

\$66 M Competitive Construction Grants

- These funds will help to fund the highest-ranked projects in the competitive grant process.
- These projects are anticipated to begin construction and requesting reimbursement very soon after they are awarded.
- Funds will be expended between July 1, 2015 and June 30, 2018.

October 2013	Introductions, overview of Ecology grant program, review legislative language
November 2013	Discuss low-impact development (LID) and provision requirement as it relates to current funding program, review existing Ecology grant guidelines and evaluation process, discuss which current funding elements will remain in the 2014 interim program (Section 1), in addition to the long-term (2015 and beyond) program.
December 2013	Review/continue to discuss evaluative criteria for statewide stakeholders.
January 2014	Begin drafting 2014 guidance material
Feb/March 2014	Review draft funding guidelines including scoring criteria, begin discussion of expanding eligible applicants and projects for the 2015 long-term funding program
April /May	Finalize 2014 funding guidance and application review criteria
July/August	Ecology finalizes guidance documents, prepares for publication.
Sept -Dec 2014	Ecology's integrated financial assistance program 2014, Statewide funding workshops, application period opens, review, rating and ranking.
January 2015	Draft Offer List is prepared for Legislative review during 2015-17 Biennial Session Review of project-specific planning grant pilot program, assessment of implementation for the interim program (Section 1).
February/March 2015	Incorporate lessons learned into revisions of project-specific planning funds, eligibility, and scoring criteria to update funding guidelines for long-term funding program
March/April 2015	Review draft funding guidelines
May/June 2015	Update guidance and application rated questions with revisions for the long-term funding program
July -September 2015	Post updated funding guidance and prepare for new funding cycle to open October 2015.
