Quad or comparable) showing the geographic location of the proposed project(s).</p> <p>The Kennewick Irrigation District (KID) has over 23,249 accounts representing over 58,000 residents of the cities of Kennewick, Richland, West Richland and incorporated Benton County. Communicating information with the goal of changing behaviors with respect to residential irrigation practices is a challenge. For the first time in its history, KID implemented a mandatory watering scheduled for parcels less than 3 acres limiting watering to twice per week up to 30 minutes per zone/station. Watering day's and times (AM/PM) is determined by the last digit of the customers address. The project locations encompasses areas throughout the boundaries of the KID. In order to reach our customer based, KID is spending on average \$14,800.00 per month in media buys.</p>
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#### 4. DESCRIPTION OF NEED

Describe what would occur without the benefit of the proposed project(s), including: the nature of the actual hardship, both short-term and long-term impacts, the expected loss of normal water supply by percentage, and the estimated potential financial losses. Explain why these circumstances constitute a water supply emergency resulting from natural-caused drought conditions, rather than a pre-existing condition during a normal water year.

The KID's water right in a normal year is 102,674 acre feet, since our 1905 water right is subject to proration, due to the drought, the prorated level set by the United States Bureau of Reclamation has been established @ 44%; noq 46% resulting with KID facing severe water shortages without drastic action. Therefore, KID purchased air time on two local TV Stations (KNDU and KVEW) as well as airtime on five radio stations represented by Townsquare Media. During a normal water year, there is no need to run commercials because of adequate supplies. However, communicating with over 23,000 residential customers and having them comply with the mandatory watering schedule required the creation of a Code Enforcement position to enforce said schedule. In addition, KID mailed the watering schedule with notice of enforcement to all of its 23,500 +/- account holders in excess of \$10,000.00

#### 5. EXPECTED OUTCOME(S)

Describe how the projects would reduce or avoid harm or hardships and any measures planned to assure the capability and reliability of the proposed project(s) to provide an emergency water supply to the applicant.

The expected outcome, and the one we are experiencing, is lower peak demands on the supply system so there is enough water to go around to meet minimal demands dictated by crops, tree fruit, blueberries, hay, residential areas with lawns and perennial shrubs and landscape trees as well as city parks, cemeteries, churches, green belts, etc... which all are the result of substantial financial commitment by the owners. The media buys allows KID to run current information to our large customer base in the format most apt to be viewed; TV, Radio and web based social media sites. KID needs to keep pressing the watering schedule and enforcement message. In addition, KID needs to have a sustained code enforcement presence by having the code enforcement employee patrol and cite watering schedule violators. To date, we have issued over 300 warnings and that number will continue to rise throughout this water year.

#### 6. WATER SHORTAGE RESPONSE ACTIONS ALREADY TAKEN

Describe the measures taken by the applicant to plan for or mitigate the effects of drought (e.g., conservation, irrigation efficiency measures, leakage, elimination of non-essential uses).

On May 31<sup>st</sup>, KID instituted its first ever mandatory watering schedule for parcels 3 acres and less. The restriction only allows water twice per week up to 30 minutes per zone/station. For those parcels above 3 acres, project water was restricted to 3.30 gallons per minute per acre. For one week in July, that number was further reduced to 3 gallons per minute per acre for those parcels and residential customers were further restricted to no more than 20 minutes per station/zone due to extremely low river flows. Additionally, in preparation for the next drought, following the 2005 drought, KID has lined over 15 miles of earthen canals with an impermeable liner; EPDM and HDPE. Also, 12 automatic control gates were installed and are controlled by SCADA with an HMI product called Wonderware. Additionally, the district made its first media buy in March with commercials running on TV and Radio starting in April recommending watering no more than twice per week. On May 31, 2015 enforcement the mandatory watering schedule was started. KID will continue to invest heavily into conservation measures; lining, control gates and regulation reservoirs as well as public outreach and education.

KID's water right is described in the Acquavella CFO document, Court Claim No. 629, as well as the KID Water Right Settlement Agreement dated July 11, 2001, and the Amendment to the KID Water Right Settlement Agreement signed in 2011. Copies of each are attached.

The KID has partnered with the cities of Richland, West Richland and Kennewick with coordinated messaging regarding water usage in this years drought reminding rate payers not to use city water to supplement their irrigation needs and we have been attending the Kennewick Farmers Market with a Drought Information Booth in another venue to reach out to our customer base.

1. Receives and responds to complaints regarding water schedule violations.
2. Patrols district looking for water schedule violations.
3. Conducts field investigations of potential water schedule violations, including but not limited to gathering evidence, questioning witnesses, recording statements, obtaining written declarations, making findings.
4. When a violation is found, issues warnings or takes other enforcement action pursuant to KID policy.
5. Records findings and enforcement actions in the TruePoint water management system.
6. Maintains a log book related to inspection and enforcement activities.
7. Provides information to people relating to the drought.
8. Coordinates efforts with other departments, agencies, and municipalities, as reasonably needed.
9. Distributes correspondence, memoranda, notices, flyers, brochures relating to code enforcement issues and actions.
10. Prepares and submits weekly code enforcement reports to the District Manager.
11. Performs such other duties as assigned.

**MINIMUM QUALIFICATIONS:** Knowledge of code enforcement principals, practices and methods as applicable to a municipal setting; working knowledge of applicable laws, standards and regulations relating to enforcement.



### **K.I.D. Drought Watering Schedule**

Kennewick Irrigation District's daily water supply is limited by how much water we are allowed to take from the Yakima River. Scheduling allows customers to maximize equitable use of the limited water. The District requests homeowners to begin following this schedule immediately.

Homeowners should water only during their two assigned A.M. or P.M. blocks, as scheduled by the last digit of their street address (house number). Watering may be up to 30 minutes per zone, station or sprinkler.

The District will allow use of high efficiency drip or micro-spray systems, or use of hand watering or a sprinkler attached to a hose to water backyard vegetable gardens or perennials outside of the scheduled times.

This schedule was designed using statistical data, analyzed to balance customer water usage and facilitate equitable distribution to all customers. Enforcement of the schedule will begin May 31st.

## Violation of the Mandatory Watering Schedule

As of May 31<sup>st</sup>, all parcels less than 3 acres are expected to follow a mandatory watering schedule. This schedule is to ensure equitable water use for all customers. We have witnessed that you are not in compliance with watering on your scheduled day.

We are issuing this warning as a reminder and in accordance with resolution 2015-10 passed by the Board of Directors on May 19, 2015.

### The enforcement schedule is as follows:

- a. 1<sup>st</sup> and 2<sup>nd</sup> offense of watering on any day other than assigned, warning issued to property owner;
- b. 3<sup>rd</sup> offense of watering on any day other than assigned will be charged a \$100.00 penalty to property owner and water locked off for seven calendar days;
- c. 4<sup>th</sup> offense of watering on any day other than assigned will be charged a \$100.00 penalty to property owner and water locked off for remainder of season;
- d. Tampering with lock:
  1. Removal of lock by any person other than an authorized K.I.D. employee will result in a \$500.00 charge payable prior to water service being reestablished.
  2. 2<sup>nd</sup> offense will result in the irrigation service being capped for the remainder of the season with the District seeking prosecution with the county prosecutor for tampering with a public facility.

### Appeals:

- a. All charges may be appealed during the annual Board of Equalization.
- b. A landowner may appeal a lock off or capping of a turn out to the Board of Directors.

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## KENNEWICK IRRIGATION DISTRICT RESOLUTION 2015-10

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IN THE MATTER OF DROUGHT OPERATIONS AND DISTRICT EXPECTATIONS OF CUSTOMER CLASSES AND CONSEQUENCES FOR FAILURE TO FOLLOW DISTRICT DIRECTIVES AND OTHER MATTERS RELATING PROPERLY THERETO.

**WHEREAS**, the Washington State Governor declared a drought in the Yakima Basin and KID is now experiencing a prorated water supply, which supply is expected to be the least in District history; and

**WHEREAS**, the Board of Directors adopted Policy 8.3 entitled "Drought Plan" on March 18, 2014 which sets forth general guidelines that seek to minimize the effects of a drought; and

**WHEREAS**, the District staff has refined the operational approach that will govern the daily operations of the district; and

**WHEREAS**, the transmission and distribution water delivery system will provide irrigation water based on the last digit of individual addresses for some customers on certain specified days and require those customers not to water on other days in order to equitably share the District's limited water supply, and the usage of water on days other than those designated will result in an unfair and inequitable benefit to the persons using water on days other than their designated days;

**WHEREAS**; the Board of Directors has the power and duty under RCW 87.03.115 to adopt equitable bylaws, rules and regulations rules for the distribution of water within the district, and believes that it is equitable for penalties to be imposed upon those landowners who violate the water scheduling rules that are necessary to equitably distribute the water among KID's customers;

### **NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED**


1. Enforcement of water availability schedule:
  - a. 1<sup>st</sup> and 2<sup>nd</sup> offense of watering on any day other than assigned, warning issued to property owner;
  - b. 3<sup>rd</sup> offense of watering on any day other than assigned will be charged a \$100.00 penalty and valve locked off for seven calendar days;

- c. 4<sup>th</sup> offense of watering on any day other than assigned will be charged a \$100.00 penalty to property owner and water locked off for remainder of season;
- 2. Tampering with lock:
  - a. Removal of lock by any person other than an authorized KID employee will result in a \$500.00 charge payable prior to water service being reestablished.
  - b. 2<sup>nd</sup> offense will result in the irrigation service being capped for the remainder of the season with the District seeking prosecution with the county prosecutor for tampering with a public facility.
- 3. Appeals:
  - a. All charges may be appealed during the annual Board of Equalization.
  - b. A landowner may appeal a lock off or capping of a turn out to the Board of Directors.



**Policy 8.3**  
**Drought Plan**

Policy 8.3 Drought Plan is intended to rescind and replace Policy and Procedure #61 Water Rationing. It is in the interest of the District to engage in long term planning to minimize the effects of future droughts, and to engage in near term planning to minimize the effects of a drought in the next water year. Planning for flexibility is essential, as each drought is different, and there are several variables to consider such as the amount and duration of the snowpack, the amount of carryover storage in the five United States Bureau of Reclamation (USBR) reservoirs, the weather patterns during the irrigation season, Endangered Species Act-related river target flow minimums, and the availability of return flows.

**1. Policy Goals:**


- 1.1. KID's planning should emphasize an adaptive approach to managing water in future droughts in order to maximize the District's flexibility;
- 1.2. KID should budget annually to build emergency drought mitigation funds in full water supply years in order to be prepared for the costs associated with drought (Reference Policy 2.37 Drought Mitigation Fund);
- 1.3. Within the constraints of the District's water rights, KID should limit the issuance of new water allotments to agricultural uses, infill residential uses, and uses which further implementation of the determined plan of future development embodied in Resolution 2010-34;
- 1.4. KID management is authorized to pursue purchase of supplemental water or access to supplemental water at the 70% supply level and above;
- 1.5. KID should encourage on-farm drought relief wells and on-farm storage ponds for growers to self insure against future drought and offer technical assistance;
- 1.6. Relegated and recalibrated Yakima River water allotments and conserved water savings should be banked for use in future drought years;
- 1.7. KID should be prepared to pay agricultural landowners (e.g. those larger than ten (10) acres) to fallow their land during a drought to the extent that wise fiscal management of District resources allows, and may adopt an enabling provision in the applicable District policy;
- 1.8. The order of prioritization<sup>1,2</sup> by which types of water users get more or less of their allotment than the projected pro-ration percentage shall be:
  - 1.8.1. Perennial crops
  - 1.8.2. Annual crops
  - 1.8.3. Public spaces (parks, cemeteries, schools, street trees)
  - 1.8.4. Golf courses
  - 1.8.5. Residential landscape trees, shrubs, and gardens
  - 1.8.6. Residential lawns
- 1.9. KID management is authorized to direct staff to prepare plans to be ready to drill emergency drought relief wells quickly if authorized by the Governor, and should also be prepared to assist farmers with existing wells to supplement with groundwater during a drought, if such actions are determined to have a beneficial impact on water supply (Reference WAC 173-166-070).

- 1.10. Projects in the capital program should be prioritized to minimize the effects of drought, such as re-regulation reservoirs, control gates, automation, etc.
2. Monthly supply percentages will vary in each drought depending on the adopted Total Water Supply Available (TWSA) forecast, but the following supply scenarios shall be considered for initial planning purposes:
- 2.1. **Supply Scenario of 85%**
- 89,409 total acre-feet (amount delivered to head of Main Canal)
  - Pro-rationing occurs, but no drought proclamation is issued by Ecology.
- 2.2. **Supply Scenario of 70%**
- 73,631 total acre-feet (amount delivered to head of Main Canal)
  - Yakima River Basin Water Enhancement Project (YRBWEP) drought planning level.
3. In responding to a near term drought forecast, the District will consider the following actions to optimize the available water supply:
- 3.1. **Maximize the available USBR water supply by:**
- 3.1.1. Minimizing operational spills through canal management and automation;
  - 3.1.2. Encouraging temporary water allotment transfers under Policy 4.21;
  - 3.1.3. Maximizing fallowed land within the KID through incentives;
  - 3.1.4. Capturing return flows (e.g. Amon Wasteway to the CID Main Canal);
  - 3.1.5. Precluding the delivery of excess water;
  - 3.1.6. Utilizing USBR storage water if available (up to 18,000 acre-feet as pro-rated).
- 3.2. **Utilize the following flexible water supply measures, as needed:**
- 3.2.1. Remove all available water out of short term trust, including the associated drive water (requires a written notice to Ecology thirty (30) days before intended diversion date);
  - 3.2.2. Supply Pressurized Service Area (PSA) 120 directly from the East Badger Drain (West Fork Amon) with a temporary pump;
  - 3.2.3. Prepare to run changes/transfers through the Water Transfer Working Group (WTWG) quickly (Reference WAC 173-166-080);
  - 3.2.4. Maximize the available supply in order to minimize the need to purchase water;
  - 3.2.5. Activate supplementation measures;
  - 3.2.6. Supplement with non-USBR water in canals (e.g. ground water sources, municipal sources, other irrigation district sources, etc.);
  - 3.2.7. Water should be available to some urban users at each individual home from the cities. Communication and coordination with the cities is important to ensure optimum water availability for users;
  - 3.2.8. Seek to obtain additional supply through the fallowing of land in upstream districts (Sunnyside Valley Irrigation District, Kittitas Reclamation District, Yakima-Tieton Irrigation District, Naches-Selah Irrigation District, etc.);
  - 3.2.9. Obtain contracts/Memorandum of Understandings for supplemental water sources before the crisis hits;
  - 3.2.10. Pursue other sources of supplemental water.
- 3.3. **Water User Education Measures and Communications:**
- 3.3.1. Get the message out to water users and water masters early to reduce water usage through radio/TV/direct mail/print media/website;

- 3.3.2. Emphasize efficient watering practices before a drought, and even more so during a drought;
  - 3.3.3. Explain the water supply supplementation options;
  - 3.3.4. Explain what steps the District is taking to maximize and enhance water supply;
  - 3.3.5. Be consistent in the messages;
  - 3.3.6. Get the message out that there will be water supply limitations before there is a drought;
  - 3.3.7. Anticipate the need to reactivate the duties performed by the Water Coordinator during prior drought years;
  - 3.3.8. Clarify the District's enforcement policy for water delivery in drought years.
  - 3.4. **Treat all USBR supplied water users equitably:**
    - 3.4.1. Reduce Columbia Irrigation District supplied customers to the same level as USBR project supplied residential customers from the canal system, unless they are supplied in another manner;
    - 3.4.2. Those served from the wasteways and drains can be given a more full supply from on-project return flows that would otherwise go unused.
  - 3.5. **Be prepared to respond quickly to advocate for appropriate state funding from the Legislature, and for drought relief funds from Ecology.**
4. The District will plan for long term drought mitigation measures by considering the following actions to optimize the available water supply:
- 4.1. Protect the current water rights that KID holds;
  - 4.2. Prepare for the impacts of climate change on water supplies;
  - 4.3. Continue to explore use of Columbia River water from the 1990 and 1992 permits;
  - 4.4. Build a portfolio of diversified water rights as availability of additional water rights and wise fiscal management of District resources allow;
  - 4.5. Explore implementation of the YRBWEP Integrated Plan;
  - 4.6. Explore the electrification of pumps in the Chandler Pumping Plant;
  - 4.7. Encourage change of urban and residential water user practices to improve on water use efficiency;
  - 4.8. Invest in capital improvements which maximize efficiency;
  - 4.9. Bank water allotments from relegated properties and from recalibrated properties;
  - 4.10. Incentivize the elimination of the remaining rill irrigation practices in the District;
  - 4.11. Ensure that no water is being applied to land lacking a water allotment;
  - 4.12. Install system-wide automated check gates at key locations to better operate the canals in low flow conditions and to minimize operational spills;
  - 4.13. Improve measurement capabilities at the turnouts to prevent the over-delivery of water;
  - 4.14. Pursue residential water efficiency grants;
  - 4.15. Continue aggressive water user education efforts to promote a culture of residential water use efficiency;
  - 4.16. Explore possible District actions which would encourage xeriscape of all types.

**EXHIBIT B**  
**KID STANDARD TERMS AND CONDITIONS (REV. 1/11)**

1. Attorney's Fees and Costs. If litigation is instituted arising directly or indirectly out of this Agreement, the losing party shall pay to the prevailing party the prevailing party's reasonable attorney's fees and court costs as determined by the court, at trial and on any appeal there from.

2. Binding Effect; Assignment. This Agreement shall bind and inure to the benefit of the parties and their respective heirs, legal representatives, successors, and assigns. This agreement is personal to Contractor and may not be assigned without the prior written approval of KID.

3. Computation of Time. Unless otherwise expressly specified herein, any period of time specified in this Agreement shall expire at 5:00 p.m. on the last calendar day of the specified period of time, unless the last day is Saturday, Sunday, or a legal holiday, as prescribed in RCW 1.16.050, in which event the specified period of time shall expire at 5:00 p.m. of the next business day.

4. Controlling Law; Severability; Venue. This Agreement shall be interpreted under the laws of the State of Washington. Should any term or provision of this Agreement, or any part thereof, be held unenforceable for any reason, such unenforceable term or provision, or part thereof, shall not affect the remainder of this contract, it being agreed the provisions hereof are severable. Any suit or action based on, arising out of, or related to this Agreement shall be brought only in the Washington State Court having subject matter jurisdiction sitting in Benton County, Washington.

5. Entire Agreement. This agreement contains the entire agreement of the parties and supersedes and replaces any and all prior or contemporaneous agreements or understandings, written or oral, express or implied, between the parties concerning the subject matter of this agreement.

6. Modification/Amendment/Change in Work. This Agreement shall not be subject to modification, amendment, or change in work except by written agreement signed by the parties. KID is not bound by any modification, amendment or change in work except by action expressly authorized by the Board of Directors either by Resolution specific to this contract or expressly authorized by formally adopted policy delegating authority to a particular officer or employee of KID.

7. Waiver. Failure of either party to enforce any of the provisions of this agreement shall not be construed as a waiver by that party of any such provisions or of the right of such party to thereafter strictly enforce each and every provision of this agreement. Failure to declare a breach or the actual waiver of any particular breach of the Contract or its material or nonmaterial terms by either party shall not operate as a waiver by such party of any of its rights or remedies as to any other breach. KID may not waive any benefit to which it is entitled under this Contract except by action expressly authorized by the Board of Directors either by Resolution specific to this contract or expressly authorized by formally adopted policy delegating authority to a particular officer or employee of KID.

8. Insurance. Contractor shall purchase and maintain in force an insurance policy having a minimum of \$1 Million combined single limit per occurrence/\$2 Million aggregate for bodily injury and property damage covering any injury or damage arising from or related to the work Contractor is performing pursuant to this contract, which policy shall name KID as an additional insured. Each insurance policy shall provide for a waiver of subrogation against KID, its officers, employees and immune contractors for losses arising from work/materials/equipment performed or provided by or on behalf of the Contractor. All required liability policies shall provide cross-liability coverage as would be achieved under the

standard ISO separation of insured's clause. Any insurance or self-insurance available to KID shall be in excess of and non-contributing with, any insurance required from Contractor. Contractor's insurance policies shall apply on a primary basis. Insurance maintained by Contractor shall apply on a first dollar basis without application of a deductible or self insured retention unless otherwise specifically agreed to by the State. Such approval shall not relieve Contractor from the obligation to pay any deductible or self insured retention. Any deductible or self-insured retention shall not exceed fifty thousand dollars (\$50,000.00) per occurrence, unless otherwise approved by the KID Secretary Manager. The insurance required of Contractor shall be issued by insurance companies authorized to do business in the State of Washington or eligible surplus lines insurers acceptable to the KID and having agents in Washington upon who service of process may be made; and shall be rated by A.M. Best as "A-VII" or better. The policy will provide a 30-day cancellation notice to the additional insured's. Contractor shall provide a certified copy of the insurance policy to KID prior to starting work on the contract. Contractor shall renew the policy prior to the end of the policy term and shall continue to renew said policy so long as this contract remains in effect. Contractor shall, prior to the end of each policy term, provide a certified copy of the insurance policy showing that the policy has been renewed. Failure to renew the policy, cancellation of the policy, and/or failure to provide a certified copy of the insurance policy showing renewal shall, unless waived in writing by KID, cause the immediate termination of this agreement.

#### 9. Inspection & Audit.

a. Books and Records. Contractor agrees to keep and maintain under generally accepted accounting principles (GAAP) full, true and complete records, contracts, books, and documents as are necessary to fully disclose to the State or United States Government, or their authorized representatives, upon audits or reviews, sufficient information to determine compliance with all state and federal regulations and statutes.

b. Inspection & Audit. Contractor agrees that the relevant books, records (written, electronic, computer related or otherwise), including, without limitation, relevant accounting procedures and practices of Contractor or its subcontractors, financial statements and supporting documentation, and documentation related to the work product shall be subject, at any reasonable time, to inspection, examination, review, audit, and copying at any office or location of Contractor where such records may be found, with or without notice by the State Auditor, the relevant state agency or its contracted examiners, the Department of Administration, Budget Division, the Washington State Attorney General's Office, and with regard to any federal funding, the relevant federal agency, the Comptroller General, the General Accounting Office, the Office of the Inspector General, or any of their authorized representatives. All subcontracts shall reflect requirements of this paragraph.

c. Period of Retention. All books, records, reports, and statements relevant to this Contract must be retained a minimum three (3) years, and for five (5) years if any federal funds are used pursuant to the Contract. The retention period runs from the date of payment for the relevant goods or services by the State, or from the date of termination of the Contract, whichever is later. Retention time shall be extended when an audit is scheduled or in progress for a period reasonably necessary to complete an audit and/or to complete any administrative and judicial litigation which may ensue.

10. Force Majeure. Neither party shall be deemed to be in violation of this Contract if it is prevented from performing any of its obligations hereunder due to forces beyond that parties control, including but not limited to strikes, failure of public transportation, civil or military authority, act of public enemy, accidents, fires, explosions, or acts of God, including without limitation, earthquakes, floods, winds, or storms. In such an event the intervening cause must not be through the fault of the party asserting such an excuse, and the excused party is obligated to promptly perform in accordance with the terms of the Contract after the intervening cause ceases.

11. Indemnification. To the fullest extent permitted by law Contractor shall indemnify, hold harmless and defend, not excluding KID's right to participate, KID from and against all liability, claims, actions, damages, losses, and expenses, including, without limitation, reasonable attorneys' fees and costs, arising out of any negligent or willful acts or omissions of Contractor, its officers, employees and agents.

12. Independent Contractor. Contractor is associated with the KID only for the purposes and to the extent specified in this Contract, and in respect to performance of the contracted services pursuant to this Contract, Contractor is and shall be an independent contractor and, subject only to the terms of this Contract, shall have the sole right to supervise, manage, operate, control, and direct performance of the details incident to its duties under this Contract. Nothing contained in this Contract shall be deemed or construed to create a partnership or joint venture, to create relationships of an employer-employee or principal-agent, or to otherwise create any liability for the KID whatsoever with respect to the indebtedness, liabilities, and obligations of Contractor or any other party. Contractor shall be solely responsible for, and KID shall have no obligation with respect to: (1) withholding of income taxes, FICA or any other taxes or fees; (2) industrial insurance coverage; (3) participation in any group insurance plans available to employees of the KID; (4) participation or contributions by either Contractor or the State to the Public Employees Retirement System; (5) accumulation of vacation leave or sick leave; or (6) unemployment compensation coverage provided by the KID. Contractor shall indemnify and hold KID harmless from, and defend KID against, any and all losses, damages, claims, costs, penalties, liabilities, and expenses arising or incurred because of, incident to, or otherwise with respect to any such taxes or fees. Neither Contractor nor its employees, agents, or representatives shall be considered employees, agents, or representatives of the KID. KID and Contractor shall evaluate the nature of services and the term of the Contract negotiated in order to determine "independent contractor" status, and shall monitor the work relationship throughout the term of the Contract to ensure that the independent contractor relationship remains as such.

13. Compliance with Legal Obligations. Contractor shall procure and maintain for the duration of this Contract any state, county, city or federal license, authorization, waiver, permit, qualification or certification required by statute, ordinance, law, or regulation to be held by Contractor to provide the goods or services required by this Contract. Contractor will be responsible to pay all taxes, assessments, fees, premiums, permits, and licenses required by law. Contractor agrees to be responsible for payment of any such government obligations not paid by its subcontractors during performance of this Contract.

14. KID Ownership of Proprietary Information. Any reports, histories, studies, tests, manuals, instructions, photographs, negatives, blue prints, plans, maps, data, system designs, computer code (which is intended to be consideration under the Contract), or any other documents or drawings, prepared or in the course of preparation by Contractor (or its subcontractors) in performance of its obligations under this Contract shall be the exclusive property of KID and all such materials shall be delivered into KID possession by Contractor upon completion, termination, or cancellation of this Contract. Contractor shall not use, willingly allow, or cause to have such materials used for any purpose other than performance of Contractor's obligations under this Contract without the prior written consent of the KID. Notwithstanding the foregoing, KID shall have no proprietary interest in any materials licensed for use by the KID that are subject to patent, trademark or copyright protection.

15. Public Records Disclosure. Pursuant to Washington state law, including without limitation RCW Ch. 42.56, all documents and information KID receives from Contractor in any form, including without limitation email or other electronic files, may be open to public inspection and copying. KID has a legal obligation to disclose such information unless a particular record is exempted from disclosure by law. Contractor may label specific parts of an individual document as a "trade secret" or "confidential" and cite the provision of RCW Ch. 42.56 that Contractor believes exempts the record. KID's sole obligation

regarding documents so designated is to notify Contractor that it has received a request that KID believes includes the designated record within three business days of KID's receipt of the request.

16. Federal Funding. In the event federal funds are used for payment of all or part of this Contract:

a. Contractor certifies, by signing this Contract, that neither it nor its principals are presently debarred, suspended, proposed for debarment, declared ineligible or voluntarily excluded from participation in this transaction by any federal department or agency. This certification is made pursuant to the regulations implementing Executive Order 12549, Debarment and Suspension, 28 C.F.R. pt. 67, § 67.510, as published as pt. VII of the May 26, 1988, Federal Register (pp. 19160-19211), and any relevant program-specific regulations. This provision shall be required of every subcontractor receiving any payment in whole or in part from federal funds.

b. Contractor and its subcontractors shall comply with all terms, conditions, and requirements of the Americans with Disabilities Act of 1990 (P.L. 101-136), 42 U.S.C. 12101, as amended, and regulations adopted there under contained in 28 C.F.R. 26.101-36.999, inclusive, and any relevant program-specific regulations.


c. Contractor and its subcontractors shall comply with the requirements of the Civil Rights Act of 1964, as amended, the Rehabilitation Act of 1973, P.L. 93-112, as amended, and any relevant program-specific regulations, and shall not discriminate against any employee or offer or for employment because of race, national origin, creed, color, sex, religion, age, disability or handicap condition (including AIDS and AIDS-related conditions.)

17. Scrutiny; Interpretation. This Agreement has been submitted to the scrutiny of all parties and their respective legal counsel and shall be given a fair and reasonable interpretation in accordance with the words hereof without consideration or weight being given to its being drafted by or for one of the parties. If in fact one of the parties has not submitted this Agreement to the scrutiny of their legal counsel, such party stipulates that, despite having had the opportunity to do so, they waived the same and elected to proceed without the benefit of such legal review.

18. Proper Authority. The parties hereto represent and warrant that the person executing this Contract on behalf of each party has full power and authority to enter into this Contract. Contractor acknowledges that as required by statute or regulation this Contract is effective only after approval by the KID Board of Directors or by the Secretary Manager when the Secretary Manager is authorized to bind the District pursuant to an applicable policy formally adopted by a majority of the Board of Directors that delegate's authority to the Secretary Manager. Any services performed by Contractor before this Contract is made effective by execution with proper authority or after it ceases to be effective are performed at the sole risk and expense of Contractor.

**KENNEWICK IRRIGATION DISTRICT  
WATER RIGHT SETTLEMENT AGREEMENT**

This is an Agreement among the Kennewick Irrigation District, the Washington State Department of Ecology ("Ecology"), the United States, and the Yakama Nation for the settlement and agreement of certain issues involving certain water rights in the Washington State Department of Ecology v. Acquavella ("Acquavella") adjudication. The parties to this Agreement (the "parties") will provide the Acquavella Court with a contemporaneously executed Stipulation Re: Kennewick Irrigation District Claim No. 629 ("Stipulation") listing the quantification of these water rights from Paragraph 1.a., below.

1.a. The parties agree that the United States should and shall be confirmed on behalf of the Kennewick Division of the Yakima Project, the Kennewick Irrigation District and their water users entitled to delivery from the Kennewick Division and the Kennewick Irrigation District (collectively referred to herein as "KID") water rights sufficient to permit diversion for beneficial use of:

i. Quantity (Acre-feet)

Total quantity applied to beneficial use is 231,017 acre-feet, more fully described as follows:

(1) To divert with an August 6, 1891 priority date up to and including 18,000 acre-feet per annum,

(a) of which from 15,600 up to the full 18,000 acre-feet, measured at the KID Main Canal headworks, may be diverted from the Yakima River at Prosser Dam, and

(b) of which up to 2,400 acre-feet, measured at Wanawish Dam (formerly Horn Rapids Dam), may be diverted from the Yakima River at Wanawish Dam.

(2) To divert with a May 10, 1905 priority date up to and including 213,017 acre-feet per annum, from the Yakima River at Prosser Dam, 84,674 acre-feet to be measured at the KID Main Canal headworks, and 128,343 acre-feet to be calculated from the 2 hydraulic pumps at the Chandler pumping plant.

ii. Diversion Rate (Cubic Feet Per Second)

Combined total diversions to KID may not exceed 782 cfs. This is a combination of a maximum of 345 cfs measured at the KID Main Canal headworks, a maximum of 431 cfs calculated from the 2 hydraulic pumps at the Chandler pumping plant and up to an additional 6 cfs diverted at Wanawish Dam. These diversions are more fully described as follows:

(1) To divert with an August 6, 1891 priority date up to and including 50 cfs, measured at KID Main Canal headworks and Wanawish Dam, and

(2) To divert with a May 10, 1905 priority date up to and including 732 cfs. This is a combination of a maximum of 301 cfs measured at the KID Main Canal headworks and a maximum of 431 cfs calculated from the 2 hydraulic pumps at the Chandler pumping plant.

iii. Purposes of Use

(1) Of the rights in 1.a.i.(1) and 1.a.ii.(1), above, up to 18,000 acre-feet for irrigation and other U.S./KID purposes, measured at KID Main Canal headworks and Wanawish Dam.

(2) Of the right in 1.a.i.(2) and 1.a.ii.(2), above, up to 84,674 acre-feet for irrigation and other U.S./KID purposes, measured at KID Main Canal headworks.

(3) Of the right in 1.a.i.(2) and 1.a.ii.(2) above, up to 128,343 acre-feet to power 2 hydraulic pumps, calculated at the Chandler pumping plant.

iv. Priority Date

August 6, 1891, as to 18,000 acre-feet annually, and May 10, 1905, as to the remainder.

v. Points of Diversion

- (1) Prosser Dam, 1350 feet west and 350 feet south, more or less, from the northeast corner of Section 2, T. 8 N., R. 24 E.W.M., being within the east 1/2 of the northeast 1/4 of the northwest 1/4 of the northeast 1/4 and the west 1/2 of the northwest 1/4 of the northeast 1/4 of the northeast 1/4 of said Section 2.
- (2) Chandler pumping plant, 2450 feet west and 1700 feet south, more or less from the northeast corner of Section 17, being within the west 1/2 of the northwest 1/4 of the southwest 1/4 of the northeast 1/4 of Section 17, T. 9 N., R. 26 E.W.M.
- (3) KID Main Canal headworks, 200 feet east and 1100 feet north, more or less, from the southwest corner of Section 16, being within the northwest 1/4 of the southwest 1/4 of the southwest 1/4 of Section 16, T. 9 N., R. 26 E.W.M.
- (4) Wanawish Dam, 2400 feet east and 3500 feet south, more or less, from the northwest corner of Section 3, being within the southeast 1/4 of the northeast 1/4 of the southwest 1/4 of Section 3, T.10 N., R. 27 E.W.M.

vi. Place of Use

- (1) Chandler pumping plant, 2450 feet west and 1700 feet south, more or less from the northeast corner of Section 17, being within the west 1/2 of the northwest 1/4 of the southwest 1/4 of the northeast 1/4 of Section 17, T. 9 N., R. 26 E.W.M.
- (2) 20,201 currently irrigated irrigable acres within the boundaries of Kennewick Irrigation District as designated by authority of the Secretary of the Interior and as described in Kennewick Irrigation District Exhibit Nos. 160 through 160-42.

vii. Period of Use

April 1 to October 31.

1.b. Monthly maximum quantities for the KID Main Canal will be the maximum amounts as provided in the Bureau of Reclamation/KID Amendatory Repayment Contract of April 7, 1959 as amended to date<sup>1</sup>, provided that, the right to divert water shall cease at any time in a year when the total annual actual diversion of the 102,674 acre-feet (subject to the terms of the above Contract including prorationing) is reached as measured at the KID Main Canal headworks and at Wanawish Dam for irrigation and other U.S./ KID purposes provided herein.

Regardless of whether the amounts of water ultimately decreed for KID in Acquavella are greater than the above amounts, KID covenants to and does limit and restrict its diversions and rights of appropriation of those rights under federal and state law to the above amounts in Paragraph 1.a., and KID further waives all claims to divert for beneficial use any greater quantities of water under the rights claimed by KID in Acquavella in Paragraph 1.a., above, and on any greater acreage than the 20,201 acres subject to Paragraph 4, below, pursuant to state or federal law, contract or decree. So long as the terms and provisions of this Agreement are effective, all parties to this Agreement covenant not to object to entry of a decree in Acquavella sufficient to allow such diversions by KID.

This Agreement among the parties resolves all claims to water by the Kennewick Irrigation District on behalf of itself and its water users in Acquavella. Nothing herein shall act as a legal or factual admission involving or concerning water rights other than those described above, including water rights claimed by any non-signatory party, e.g., Columbia Irrigation District. The United States and Kennewick Irrigation District, on their own behalf and on behalf of KID, expressly waive

any water right claims that they did or could have filed in this case for KID beyond what is expressly provided in this Agreement. KID is consequently waiving claims to 14,852 acre-feet of May 10, 1905 priority diversion rights at the KID Main Canal headworks and Chandler pumping plant (6,601 acre-feet for irrigation and 8,251 acre-feet for hydraulic pumping). The United States will not divert any portion of the 14,852 acre-feet reduction from claimed amounts into the Chandler Canal for alternative use in hydroelectric power generation at the Chandler hydropower generation facilities.

The quantities stated in Paragraph 1.a., above, do not include water for conveyance loss between Prosser Dam and Chandler Pumping Plant. The United States agrees to divert no more than 10 additional c.f.s. of water at Prosser Dam for conveyance losses associated with the transportation of the KID water rights described in Paragraph 1.a., above. This additional 10 c.f.s. will be subject to proration to the same extent as the water rights stated above in Paragraph 1.a. The Kennewick Irrigation District waives any claim against the United States for diversion at Prosser Dam of any greater water quantity than the water rights stated above in Paragraph 1.a. (subject to proration) plus this 10 c.f.s. for conveyance loss.

1.c. The United States will operate the Prosser Diversion Dam to meet the target flows as established pursuant to § 1205 of the Yakima River Basin Water Enhancement Project Act, Pub. L. No. 103-434, Title XII, Act of October 31, 1994, 108 Stat. 4526, 4550 ("YRBWEP"), plus an additional 35 c.f.s.. When necessary, this will be accomplished through bypass of water that might otherwise be diverted to power generation at Chandler April 1 to October 31 when the Chandler hydropower generation facilities are operating. This is not intended to quantify or define the Yakama Nation's Treaty right. The United States does not intend to abandon its claim to this 35 c.f.s. Notwithstanding this bypass flow commitment, the U.S. reserves the right to divert the minimum amount necessary to maintain its full claimed Chandler hydropower water rights pursuant to law; the United States will consult with the Yakama Nation on such use to protect instream flow in the

bypass. Nothing herein is intended to address nor be an admission as to any issue involving the United States claim with the exception of the water rights of the Kennewick Irrigation District and its water users. Under no circumstances will this bypass flow require release of water from storage, authorize impairment of other existing United States' commitments, or prejudice other existing water rights.

1.d. KID will submit proof of appropriation, and Ecology will issue a water right certificate, in the quantity of 231,017 acre-feet annually to the United States in accordance with Paragraph 1.a., above, for the use and benefit of KID pursuant to KID's permit, and pursuant to KID's repayment contracts with the United States. The Certificate issued for the 1905 water right described above in Paragraph 1.a., above, shall identify the place of use as the irrigable lands of the KID as determined now or hereafter by the Secretary of the Interior or the Secretary's designee/successor, provided that no more than 20,201 acres may be irrigated and no more than 102,674 acre-feet may be used for irrigation and other U.S./KID purposes in any irrigation season, under both the 1905 priority date water right and 1891 priority date water right.

The parties agree the Certificate issued for a 1905 water right described in Paragraph 1.a., above, should be confirmed as an adjudicated water right. In addition, the parties agree the 1891 priority 50 c.f.s., 18,000 acre foot annually, water right described in Paragraph 1.a., above, should be confirmed as an adjudicated water right.

2.a. The Yakama Nation, Ecology, United States, and KID agree not to appeal the above terms in paragraph 1.a. present in any Report(s) of the Court and/or the Conditional Final Order(s) for KID, subject to Paragraph 15, below. This does not preclude the parties from cross appealing or responding to an appeal in the event that either the Report(s) of the Court or Conditional Final Order for KID is appealed by any non-signatory to this Agreement.

2.b. The Kennewick Irrigation District agrees not to appeal terms in Report(s) of the Court and/or the Conditional Final Order(s) for the Yakima-Tieton Irrigation District ("YTID"), or any other non-signatory party that do not affect the Report(s) of the Court and/or the Conditional Final Order(s) for KID and do not impair KID's water rights as agreed to herein. This does not preclude the Kennewick Irrigation District from cross appealing or responding to an appeal in the event that a Report(s) of the Court or Conditional Final Order(s) for YTID or another non-signatory party is appealed if the resolution of such appeal might affect the Report(s) of the Court and/or the Conditional Final Order(s) for KID or impair KID's water rights as agreed to in Paragraph 1.a., above.

2.c. The parties agree that any water interests claimed by, but not confirmed to KID, remain with or revert to the United States for use in satisfaction of the Yakama Nation's reserved water rights and Yakima Project purposes as described below. Those uses include the following:

- i. meeting the Yakama Nation's time immemorial Treaty rights;
- ii. meeting the Yakama Nation's 1855 Treaty rights;
- iii. complying with the 1945 federal Consent Decree in Kittitas Reclamation District v. Sunnyside Valley Irrigation District (E.D. Wash.) (Civil Action No. 21) ("1945 Consent Decree"), including meeting nonproratable and proratable rights;
- iv. enhancing Yakama Nation Treaty trust assets;
- v. implementing the Yakima River Basin Water Enhancement Project, P.L. 103-434, Title XII, Act of October 31, 1994, 108 Stat. 4526, 4550 (YRBWEP);
- vi. retention of water in carryover storage from year to year;
- vii. other existing federal contractual water distribution obligations within the Basin and;
- viii. other federally authorized project purposes consistent with federal law and state law (unless preempted by federal law).

The listing of these uses is not intended to and does not prioritize these uses or establish water rights.

2.d. The parties further agree that unless and until there exists an agreement or judicial resolution determining that the United States has no ability to beneficially use the water interests and surface water for purposes referenced in Paragraph 2.c., above, the water remains within the total water supply available for use, distribution, and storage by the United States.

2.e. The United States agrees that it will not deliver water to an entity holding water delivery contracts in amounts in excess of quantities confirmed in an agreement or judicial resolution for that entity's water rights. The United States further agrees that it will not issue new contracts for new uses, or amend existing contracts for the delivery of additional quantities without first acquiring a concomitant state water right, unless in satisfaction of a federal reserved water right in accordance with law, or unless there exists an agreement or judicial resolution to the contrary.

2.f. Ecology agrees that it will not issue new water rights without consulting with the United States and the Yakama Nation. Ecology further agrees that, unless and until such time as there exists an agreement or judicial resolution determining that the United States has no ability to beneficially use water interests and surface water for purposes referenced in Paragraph 2.c., above, Ecology will not issue new surface water rights anywhere in the Yakima River Basin without a concomitant commitment by the United States to contract for the delivery of water associated with such a water right, or without a release by the United States of water from the federal enhancement program withdrawal pursuant to RCW 90.40.

2.g. Nothing herein shall be construed to impair a senior water right or to authorize impairment of a senior water right.

3. KID and Ecology agree not to appeal, seek to reopen, challenge, nor support any challenge to the Yakama Nation's Conditional Final Order dated September 12, 1996, including issues litigated in the Yakama Nation's Reports of the Court Nos. 25 (Nov. 13, 1995) and 25A (June 21, 1996).

4. Except as provided in sentence two of this Paragraph, KID agrees to use the water rights described in Paragraph 1.a., above, of this Agreement only within current district boundaries (as described in Kennewick Irrigation District Exhibit Nos. 160 through 160-42) on currently irrigated irrigable lands of 20,201 acres and to limit its use of that water to 20,201 acres of land currently authorized for service within its current boundaries. Use of the water rights described in Paragraph 1.a., above, of this Agreement on lands annexed into the district in the future, or on other lands within the district, shall be expressly contingent on exclusion from service of equivalent acreage currently authorized for service; no increase in the acreage serviced with that water; no increase in consumptive use of that water; and no increase in diversion of water under those water rights.

"Consumptive use" for purposes of this Agreement is defined as the quantity of diverted water that is lost to surface waters through evaporation, evapotranspiration, or incorporation into plant tissue. Consumptive use can vary over time due to climate, crop type, and other factors within the constraints of beneficial use.

5. KID shall not, without the written consent of the parties to this Agreement, transfer, sell, or lease any part of its water right outside of its district boundaries, provided, however, nothing herein shall preclude Kennewick Irrigation District or individuals within KID from selling or otherwise transferring the consumptive use portion of their water right for instream flow purposes, or otherwise by the written agreement of the parties to this Agreement, pursuant to and in compliance with applicable state and federal law.

6.a. KID agrees that the provisions of this Paragraph 6 would apply to the use and allocation of water saved as a result of district conservation activities, or interrelated or interdependent landowner activities within the district, funded from sources other than those appropriated pursuant to YRBWEP. YRBWEP conservation activities are not restricted by this paragraph. "Conservation" for purposes of this paragraph is defined as any non-YRBWEP activity likely to result in reduced diversions from the Yakima River without increasing consumptive use, consumptive loss or other adverse impacts to river flow.

6.b. Under no circumstance shall the on-district use of the water rights described in Paragraph 1.a., above, including water saved through conservation activities financed by either "private monies" or "public monies," exceed the consumptive portion of the water rights described in Paragraph 1.a., above. Water saved through conservation activities will not be applied to new lands or new consumptive uses without an equivalent reduction in irrigated acreage and an equivalent reduction in consumptive use. All water conserved (i.e., all diversion reduction potential) through expenditures of "public monies" through the district's conservation activities or interrelated or interdependent landowner activities within the district will be allocated according to the formulas in Subparagraphs 6.c. and 6.d., below. "Public monies" for purposes of this Agreement are defined as monies derived from state or federal appropriations or from programs authorized under the Northwest Power Act or other legislation. "Private monies" for purposes of this Agreement are defined as all monies that are not public monies (e.g., district funds, private donations, or funds obtained by loans to the district that are not repaid with public monies).

6.c. For conservation activities in which between 67% and 100% of the project financing is obtained from private monies, a maximum of 67% of the saved water shall be retained by KID to satisfy existing out-of-stream beneficial purposes as defined by State law, and a minimum of 33% shall be provided for instream flow purposes. Saved water retained for out-of-stream beneficial purposes

may only be applied to currently irrigated irrigable lands within the current boundaries of KID or such new lands as may be authorized pursuant to Paragraph 4, above.

6.d. If less than 67% of a conservation activity's funding is obtained from private monies, the amount of saved water retained for out-of-stream beneficial use shall decrease and the amount available for instream flow purposes shall increase at least in proportion to the size of the public funding. For example, if 50% of the funding for a conservation activity is private monies, a maximum of 50% of the water would be retained for out-of-stream beneficial purposes. KID may voluntarily agree to leave additional water in-stream.

6.e. KID agrees to make best efforts, and the United States, the Yakama Nation and the Department of Ecology agree to support efforts, within the scope of this section, to find non-YRBWEP funding from public monies for conservation other than the Pump Exchange currently authorized for feasibility study pursuant to Pub. L. No. 106-372. KID agrees to use such funds to implement this paragraph if such funding will produce saved water for instream flow purposes, and the conditions on such funds are acceptable to KID.

7. Should the United States apply to Ecology for administrative recognition of fish, wildlife or recreation as additional purposes of use for project water with a 1905 priority date to be administered in accordance with the legal obligations and commitments of the United States, the Yakama Nation and KID will support such application(s) and Ecology will give expedited consideration to such application(s) and process them without requiring or claiming any waiver of federal sovereign immunity. The administrative recognition by Ecology of such additional purposes of use shall not be interpreted to prejudice the obligation of the United States to deliver water to KID nor the interests of KID in the rights described in Paragraph 1.a., above.

8. The Yakama Nation, the United States, KID, and Ecology waive any and all claims against each other -- including breach of trust, attorneys fees or costs -- that arise directly and unequivocally from the negotiation and execution of this Agreement and from the terms and provisions herein for the determination of the surface water rights of the Yakima Project for KID. Nothing herein shall act to limit any Yakama Nation water right or right to the delivery of water, except to the extent that the Yakama Nation's right to the delivery of its share of proratable irrigation water from TWSA is limited in any given water-short year as a direct result of KID receiving its share of TWSA water under the terms of this Agreement as TWSA is defined in the 1945 Consent Decree.

This Agreement shall not preclude any of the parties from exercising any remedy available in the event of a breach under this Agreement or of a determination that this Agreement is void and unenforceable nor shall it act to waive any claim arising from the implementation of this Agreement. Nothing herein shall act to limit or diminish the trust responsibility owed by the United States to the Yakama Nation including the duty to protect the Treaty rights of the Yakama Nation. Except as directly and unequivocally provided for herein, nothing in this Agreement shall act to waive claims for violations of state or federal law, or expand or limit the regulatory authority or property interest of any entity under applicable federal, tribal, or state law. Nothing herein shall act to waive any claims surrounding or concerning water management in the Yakima Basin as discussed in Paragraph 2, above.

9. This Agreement shall go into effect upon execution by the parties. If for any reason within the Acquavella adjudication the quantification of water rights for KID as finally determined by the Acquavella Court becomes less than the diversion amounts provided in Paragraph 1.a., above, the individual parties retain the right to revoke or rescind this Agreement; *Provided that*, any such revocation or rescission shall not rescind Paragraphs 1.c. and 3, above.

10. This Agreement constitutes the entire Agreement among the parties with respect to the subject matter of this Agreement. It does not invalidate any prior agreements among or between the parties except as expressly specified herein. No amendment, modification or waiver of any of the provisions of this Agreement, or subsequent agreements, which the parties have agreed to or negotiated concerning this Agreement, shall go into effect unless set forth in a separate written instrument signed hereafter by the parties to be bound thereby.

11. Nothing in this Agreement is intended to create a cause of action nor other rights for any third party not a signatory to this Agreement, nor would any such party be intended to be a third party beneficiary of this Agreement. Nothing in this Agreement waives the sovereign immunity held by any party to this Agreement.

12. This Agreement is intended to compromise and settle certain issues between and among the parties and is not intended by the parties to be an admission as to any legal or factual issue except as provided herein.

13. None of the parties would be considered liable, in breach, or in default under this Agreement on account of any delay or failure to perform as required under this Agreement as a result of any cause or condition beyond the party's control.

14. This Agreement has been prepared jointly by the parties following negotiations among them. All parties were represented by legal counsel of their choosing. It shall be construed according to its terms and not for or against any of the parties.

15. Nothing in this Agreement shall be deemed to be inconsistent with the requirements of applicable federal, state, tribal law and/or treaties. Nothing in this Agreement shall be deemed to waive, abrogate, diminish, define or interpret the Treaty rights of the Yakama Nation. The parties do not construe this Agreement to waive, abrogate, diminish, define or interpret the Treaty rights of the Yakama Nation. The Yakama Nation and the United States reserve the right to appeal or seek reconsideration of a Report of the Court that it believes to be inconsistent with this Paragraph.

16.a. This is a contractual settlement agreement binding on the parties and enforceable as may be appropriate in a court of competent jurisdiction, under appropriate principles of state and/or federal law. Only signatory parties have the right to seek enforcement of this Agreement.

16.b. This Agreement will be implemented by the United States, at least in part, pursuant to, and in the course of implementing, YRBWEP and the Reclamation Act of 1902 and acts amendatory thereof and supplementary thereto, and through the operation of the Yakima Project pursuant to applicable federal laws and treaties.

16.c. Upon alleged breach of this Agreement by any party, or other disputes arising hereunder, representatives of the State of Washington, the United States, the Yakama Nation, and KID shall meet and confer in good faith to resolve their differences. In the event of any such alleged breach, or any other dispute, or if any term of this Agreement is found or believed by any of the parties to be void and unenforceable, the parties will meet and seek to reach a mutually agreeable modification. The parties may employ a mutually agreed upon mediator or other suitable facilitator if they believe this may help resolve their dispute.

16.d If, after a reasonable period of time, the parties are unable to resolve a dispute by the process outlined above, any of the parties may seek appropriate relief. The parties agree to seek declaratory relief first where there is no reason to doubt that declaratory relief will adequately resolve the

conflict. Under appropriate circumstances, other relief, including extraordinary relief, e.g., injunction, mandamus, replevin, restitution, etc., may be awarded against any of the parties in breach of this Agreement. Breach of this Agreement is a mixed question of fact and law that must be determined by a court of competent jurisdiction.

16.e. All parties shall be given timely notice of any action to enforce this Agreement. The parties agree not to object to (i) intervention or (ii) a request for removal to federal court by any of the parties. KID agrees to venue in either State court or Federal District Court for the Eastern District of Washington. If such efforts to gain judicial relief are unsuccessful due to sovereign immunity, none of the parties will oppose an action to revoke or rescind this Agreement, provided that any such revocation or rescission shall not rescind Paragraphs 1.c. and 3 of this Agreement.

16.f. Failure to seek relief in one instance of breach shall not waive the right to seek relief for a later breach.

17. For purposes of determining proration in any water short year, the parties agree that all KID water rights as described in Paragraph 1.a., above, shall be prorated based on 109,275 acre-feet subject to and consistent with the terms set forth in the Bureau of Reclamation/KID Repayment Contract of July 22, 1953, as amended to date, except that actual deliveries shall not exceed the maximum annual quantities stated in Paragraph 1.a., above.<sup>2</sup> The parties agree to this interpretation

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<sup>2</sup> Said KID/USBR contract provides in part:

Proration Among Contracting Parties

16.(a) The United States, to the extent permitted by law, will treat on an equal footing with respect to priority all authorized divisions of the project and all lands of irrigation districts, water users associations, corporations, and all water users with whom the United States has contracted or may hereafter contract under the Federal Reclamation laws, except to the extent that those provisions are modified by the decree of the United States District Court dated January 31, 1945, entered in the case of Kittitas Reclamation District, et al., Plaintiffs, vs. Sunnyside Valley Irrigation District, et al. Defendants (Civil Action No. 21, Eastern District of Washington, Southern Division). All water supply contracts hereafter made by the United States with respect to the project shall contain a similar declaration with regard to priority, and the Secretary shall, under the terms of the Federal

of the relationship of KID's water rights for purposes of compromising and settling differences among the parties as to the water rights for KID. The agreement on the issues in this Paragraph only applies to KID and is not intended to be an admission as to any legal or factual issue nor to waive any argument involving any other party or entity other than KID. The parties agree that this Agreement shall not be presented to the Acquavella Court for approval because some of the provisions of the Agreement may be beyond the interest or jurisdiction of the Acquavella Court in the adjudication. This Agreement is not intended to bind or affect any non-signatory party, and the failure of a non-signatory party to object to any provision of this Agreement cannot be viewed as waiving, affecting or prejudicing any non-signatory party's rights, factual arguments, legal arguments, or legal positions.

18. This Agreement is the result of negotiations that occurred over the course of more than a year, which negotiations involved written and oral communications by, between, and among the parties, their representatives, their attorneys, a mediator, and others. The negotiations that preceded this

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Reclamation Laws, provide for the irrigation of no greater area of land in the aggregate than will, in his opinion, render it practicable in all years of ordinary runoff to supply authorized divisions and other contractors with the amounts of water fixed and stipulated by the Secretary. In case of shortage of water in a year of unusually low runoff, such as to make it impossible to supply fully all of the lands governed by similar proration provisions, each division and each contractor shall be entitled to a supply of water diminished prorata, measured at the respective points of measurement except as otherwise limited in this article; and it shall be the duty of the project officer, in operating the reservoirs of the storage division, to divide the water in accordance with the provisions of this article. The prorata share herein provided shall be determined by the ratio of the water supply available for all divisions of the project, and for all parties making contracts of tenor similar to this contract under the Federal Reclamation Laws involving waters of the Yakima Basin, to the total water supply fixed and stipulated for said divisions and parties, after making appropriate deductions for whatever prior rights are required to be recognized and after making appropriate adjustments on the basis of the District's existing right as defined in (a) of article 15. Delivery of such prorata share shall be received by the District in full satisfaction of the quota of water herein contracted for on behalf of the district for such irrigation season, but nothing in this article shall preclude the District during periods of proration from using water within its rights as defined by this contract if water in excess of its prorated share is available at the point of diversion without requiring the release of stored water specifically for the District's benefit.

(b) The provisions of this article and the preceding article 15 are intended, by the restatement thereof, to carry forward and to continue in operation the District's rights in the project water as defined in the Government-District contract as modified by this contract and by the decree referred to in (a) above.

Agreement at times considered arrangements that were at variance with the provisions of this Agreement. All preceding and contemporaneous oral and written statements, understandings, representations, warranties, and promises by, between, and among the parties, or any of them, whether consistent or inconsistent herewith, are agreed to be of no force or effect for any purpose whatsoever unless expressly and explicitly stated in this Agreement. This Agreement represents the complete and final agreement of the parties, is intended as the complete and exclusive statement of all parties' group and individual intent, and supersedes all prior and contemporaneous consistent and inconsistent statements, representations, warranties, understandings, negotiations, and agreements among all of the parties hereto or between any of the parties hereto that relates to the subject matter hereof, made during the course of these negotiations. This Agreement may not be supplemented, modified or amended by evidence, either oral or written, of any such matters or by course of dealing, but only by the written agreement of the parties executed with the same formality of this Agreement. The parties hereto hereby stipulate that each and every provision contained in this Agreement was expressly bargained for and that the plain meaning of said provisions memorializes the intent of the parties.

Amendment to the Kennewick Irrigation District Water Right Settlement  
Agreement  
(Additional Point of Diversion – Kiona)

The 2001 Kennewick Irrigation District Water Rights Settlement Agreement (2001 SA) was executed on July 11, 2001 among the parties to this Agreement (Parties), which include the Kennewick Irrigation District (KID), the State of Washington Department of Ecology (Ecology), the United States of America Bureau of Reclamation (Reclamation), and the Confederated Tribes and Bands of the Yakama Nation (Yakama Nation). Based on the 2001 SA, the Court, in *State of Washington Department of Ecology v. Acquavella*, Yakima County Superior Court No. 77-2-01484, confirmed the water rights in the name of the U.S. Bureau of Reclamation on behalf of KID (US/KID water right), in a Conditional Final Order (CFO) issued on October 16, 2001.

The Parties hereto agree as follows:

1. AMENDMENTS/OTHER AGREEMENTS

a. The terms of the 2001 SA are incorporated by reference herein and are not changed by this Amendment except as expressly provided herein. The Parties agree that all provisions contained in the SA will remain in full force and effect, except where amended, or modified, herein. Nothing in this Agreement shall be deemed to waive, abrogate, diminish, define or interpret the Treaty rights of the Yakama Nation.

b. The signatory Parties herein may also be parties to other agreements related to matters identified in this Amendment. Nothing in this Amendment is intended to amend other agreements

c. No party to this Amendment is bound to other agreements unless it is a signatory to any of the other agreements.

2. ADDITIONAL PURPOSE OF USE

Paragraph 1(a)iii.(4) is hereby added and reads as follows:

(4) Of the right in 1.a.i.(2) and 1.a.ii. (2), above, up to approximately 64 cfs and 20,403 acre-feet for instream purposes, measured at KID Main Canal headworks. All or a portion of this quantity may be assigned to the State Trust Water Program.

3. ADDITIONAL POINT OF DIVERSION

a. The Parties hereby amend the 2001 Settlement Agreement by adding the following new subparagraph 1(a)v.(5) as follows:

(5) A new point of diversion to be constructed in the future in the vicinity of Kiona, Washington (Parcel No. 117973000002002 ) to service the area commonly known as "Red Mountain," as generally reflected in the Map attached hereto as Exhibit "1" and as described in the Assessment Roll attached hereto as Exhibit "2," Provided that the quantify that may diverted at Prosser Dam shall be reduced as shown in Exhibit 3.

#### 4. PLACE OF USE CHANGE

Paragraph 1(a)vi.(2) is hereby modified to read as follows:

20,201 acres within the boundaries of the Kennewick Irrigation District as designated by authority of the Secretary of the Interior and as described in KID Exs. 160 through 160-42 in *Ecology v. Acquavella*, and as partially amended by Exhibit 1 and as described on Exhibit 2<sup>1</sup> attached hereto, *provided that*, no more than 20,201 acres may be irrigated at any time.

#### 5. NON-CONSUMPTIVE USE ELIGIBLE FOR INSTREAM FLOW PURPOSE

Paragraph 5 is hereby modified to allow the consumptive use portion AND the non-consumptive use portion of the KID water right to be used for instream flow purpose in the quantities reflected in Exhibit 3.

#### 6. SIGNATURES

This agreement may be signed in counterpart. Each signed counterpart shall be deemed an original, and all counterparts together shall constitute one and the same agreement. This agreement shall become effective on the date of the last signed counterpart.

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<sup>1</sup> KID may amend the assessment rolls in Exhibit 2 to change the place of use of water within the LID as described in Exhibit 1 provided that no water right limitations contained in this Agreement are changed, altered or exceeded including but not limited the number of acres that may be irrigated.
