<b>Clean Water State Revolving Fund</b>  Environmental Protection Agency	<p>\$65.4 million in funding will be provided to local governments for water pollution control infrastructure, including the upgrade and expansion of wastewater, reclaimed water and stormwater facilities statewide. The Program uses existing water quality loan and grant program criteria and eligibility and provides additional funding to meet high priority water quality needs statewide. Approximately \$2.7 million or 4% is available for administration over the course of the grant.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>- Applications for funding were accepted through March 13, 2009. The draft project list is scheduled to be released April 17. The final offer list was announced June 11. <b>Hanford Groundwater Cleanup and Contaminated Sites</b>  U.S. Dept. of Energy, Dept. of Defense, Nuclear Waste Cleanup	<p>This funding accelerates the USDOE cleanup of 80 square miles of contaminated groundwater and reduce surface contamination from 500 square miles to 20 square miles at the Hanford Nuclear Site. The combined packages would complete cleanup of Hanford's Columbia River corridor by 2015. The accelerated work would result in hiring of significant cleanup personnel by USDOE and its contractors. Builds wastewater collection and transportation system for homes in a flood plain, a tribal fish hatchery, a fish propagation facility and a bridge to replace culverts on Stratton Creek. Raises two levees to protect private property and provides water quality protection for Nippon Mill.
